Request for Citizen Comments on the Metropolitan Transportation Planning Process  
in the Tri-Cities Area

The Tri-Cities Area Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) will hold a public meeting on August 9, 2010. The purpose of this public meeting will be to obtain citizen comment on the effectiveness of the metropolitan transportation planning process for this portion of the Richmond, Virginia urbanized area. This public meeting will be conducted pursuant to Chapter I of Title 23 Code of Federal Regulations, Part 450. Representatives from the U.S. Federal Highway Administration and the U.S. Federal Transit Administration will be present to hear citizen comments about how well plans and programs developed by the Tri-Cities MPO address the transportation needs and issues of this metropolitan area.
